

- PROPERTY TAX REFORM -NJLM STEERING COMMITTEE OBJECTIVE

- "REMOVE EDUCATIONAL FUNDING COMPLETELY FROM THE PROPERTY TAX. THIS WOULD REDUCE PROPERTY TAXES BY 50 – 60%. FUND EDUCATION BY RE-ALLOCATING FUNDS FROM OTHER MAJOR REVENUE SOURCES SUCH AS INCOME TAX, SALES TAX, CORPORATE TAX, LOTTERY AND CASINO TAX, ETC." THE STATE WOULD ASSUME FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR EDUCATIONAL FUNDING.
- MAKE EDUCATIONAL FUNDING ACHIEVEABLE THROUGH A PROGRESSIVE TAXING SYSTEM, I.E. ABILITY TO PAY.

FUNDING EDUCATION IN NEW JERSEY – 2008-09 BASIC REVENUE SOURCES

- TOTAL COST OF EDUCATION = \$23.1B
- FEDERAL AID = \$762M (3.3% of total) [national average = 8.8% and NY and PA rec'd = 7.3%]
- STATE AID TO LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS = \$11.5B (49% of total)
- FEDERAL + STATE AID = \$12.3B
- BALANCE OF EDUCATION BILL PAID VIA PROPERTY TAXES = \$23.1 - \$12.3 = \$10.8B (47%)
- TO ACHIEVE OUR OBJECTIVE, \$10.8B WOULD HAVE TO BE MADEUP FROM OTHER REVENUES:
 - 1. INCOME TAX = \$12.93B
 - 2. SALES TAX = \$8.71B
 - 3. CORPORATE/BUSINESS TAX = \$2.46B
 - 4. TOLLS,CASINO,LOTTERY = \$ 8.4B
 - 5. Total = \$32.5B

OTHER APPROPRIATIONS RELATED TO PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

- BUDGETED PROPERTY TAX RELIEF WOULD NOT BE REQUIRED = \$3.3B
- THE BALANCE OF TOTAL EDUCATIONAL COST WOULD BE \$10.8B LESS \$3.3B OR <u>\$7.5B</u>
- TO IMPLEMENT OUR OBJECTIVE, \$7.5B WOULD HAVE TO BE GENERATED VIA THE DESIGNATED REVENUE SOURCES

LEADING REVENUE SOURCE CANDIDATES FOR REPLACING PROPERTY TAX EDUCATIONAL FUNDING

- STATE INCOME TAX SURCHARGE IMPOSED ACROSS THE BOARD ON ALL FILIERS BASED ON ABILITY TO PAY
- FEDERAL GOVERNMENT'S CONTRIBUTION TO NJ SCHOOL FUNDING ONLY 3.3% WHERE NATIONAL AVERAGE = 8.8% (NY & PA = 7.3%) – NJ WOULD RECEIVE \$1B MORE IF THEY REC'D 7.3% LIKE NY & PA.
- CORPORATION AND BUSINESS TAX (BUSINESSES TAKE A DOUBLE HIT AND WOULD REALIZE PROPERTY TAX RELIEF BY MOVING TO THIS APPROACH)
- UPWARD ADJUSTMENT TO SOME OTHER TAXES (SALES, LOTTERY, CASINO) TO SUPPORT EDUCATION
- REALLOCATION OF EXISTING REVENUES COULD MAKE UP
 THE \$7.5B SHORTFALL

NJ 2009 BUDGET APPROPRIATIONS FOR EDUCATION AND PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

- STATE EDUCATION AID = \$11.5B
- PROPERTY TAX RELIEF = \$3.3B
- THESE TWO APPROPRIATIONS TOTAL \$14.8B
- THE COST OF EDUCATION IN NJ IN 2009 = \$23.1B (BUDGET AND PROPERTY TAX)
- THE AMOUNT OF REVENUE NEEDED TO MAKE UP THE DIFFERENCE IS **\$7.5B**

- NJ DEPT. OF EDUCATION ENDORSED THE CONCEPT IN 2007
- APPROVED BY THE COURTS WHEN APPLIED TO ABBOT DISTRICTS

CONCEPTUAL BENEFITS USING THIS METHOD OF PROPERTY TAX REFORM

- ELIMINATE THE ADMINISTRATION OF REBATES NO REBATES
- SCHOOL BUDGETS BASED ON LOADED COST PER STUDENT AND ACTUAL STUDENT POPULATION
- STATE WOULD DISSEMINATE BUDGET FUNDING BASED ON ENROLLMENTS WEIGHTED FOR STUDENT NEEDS AND DEMOGRAPHICS
- NO MORE DEFEATED BUDGETS
- NO NEED FOR CUSTODIAN OF SCHOOL MONIES
- ONE OR REGIONAL STATE TEACHER'S CONTRACT
- NO MORE STATE MANDATES PLACED ON LOCAL BOARDS
- STATE CAN EXERT GREATER CONTROL ON EDUCATIONAL SPENDING
- EVERYONE PAYS THEIR FAIR SHARE FOR EDUCATION, I.E. HOMEOWNERS, TENANTS, AND BUSINESS
- LOBBY FOR MORE FEDERAL SCHOOL FUNDING 3.3% IS NOT ACCEPTABLE
- STOP THE EXODUS FROM NJ AND CREATE A STABLE TAX BASE AND ELIMINATE LOST TAX REVENUE
- CONSISTENCY AT LAST AND IT'S CONSTITUTIONAL...ETC.
